A list of the items. All should be found on SLT property. If you find one, write the location (either the name of the SLT property or the road you accessed it from).

Two waters. Find a post where you are about 25 yards from both brackish water and a fresh water pond.

White Well. A test well drilled in some upland in a parcel years ago to determine the height of the water table. Look in parcels near the Sippican River.

Some recyclable trash. Even our properties need some cleaning up.

Some returnable trash. Perhaps you'll consider a donation to the SLT?

A Holly tree. A characteristic tree in our maritime forest.

Blueberry bush. (berries for wildlife, bright red leaves in the autumn.

Scat. not from a dog or cat, a sign of who has been here.

A boardwalk. Our chief steward has been working with local scouts to make your visit to some properties less mucky.

White flower; Purple or Blue flower; Yellow flower

Fairy House. A small model "home" that is made by the young at heart using only materials found on the forest floor.

A split rock. The first stage of making soil, ice gets in the cracks and freezes, splitting the stone and starting to make more soil.

A stone wall. In the woods.

A quahog shell. The shellfish depend on clean water and our stewardship of the watershed.

Twigs with an odor. Some trees have a distinct smell when you scrape at the twigs. Try black cherry or try your luck.

An amphibian. Look for Red backed salamanders or many species of frogs.

An acorn, a maple seed. (winged seed)

Skunk cabbage.

A river view.

An osprey pole.

A great picnic spot.

A tree wider than 25 inches in diameter. (bring a string about 79 inches long for the circumference)

A nice log to sit upon.
